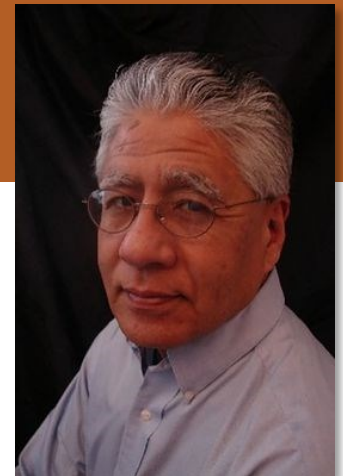

♦ Colorado Conflict Resolution Month

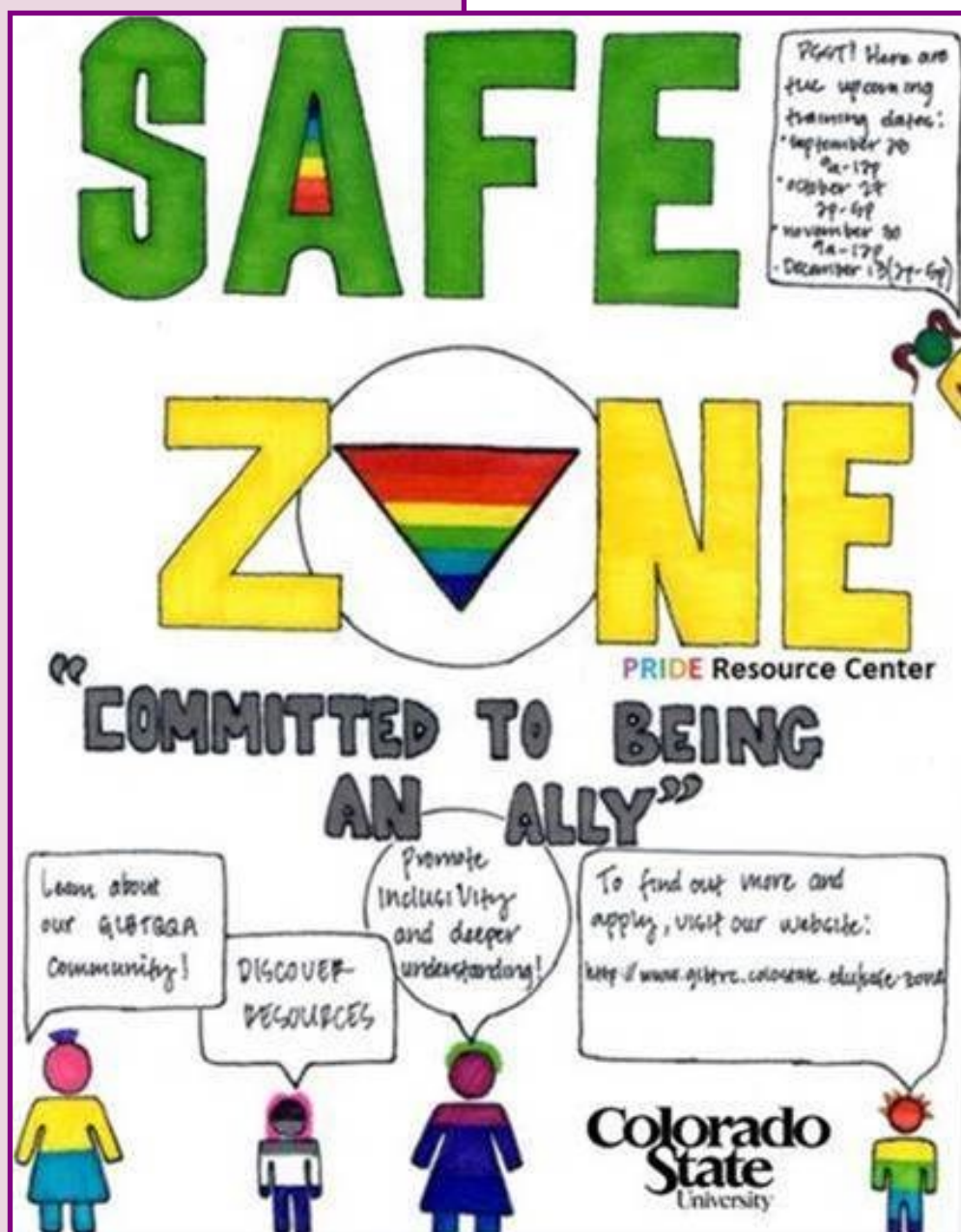
