This series is ideal for those seeking to advance their learning beyond that which can typically be covered through introductory trainings and workshops on gender, diversity, and inclusion.

#### VPD HONORS FIRSTS: BARB NELSON

Barbara Jo Nelson, the first female faculty member of the School of Education at CSU, died in her adopted home of Spokane on April 5, 2019. Barb was a faculty member at CSU for 30 years, distinguishing herself as a classroom teacher, prolific grant writer, traveling seminar leader, and student motivator. She served as PhD advisor to many prominent educators. Barbara was nationally known in teacher education circles and was often seen on educational television.
